Two birds, no words

Two birds, both willow warblers. Ringed on the same day, but 500 miles apart. One on the Isle of Arran, where it probably bred, the other in one of our village scrub patches as it stopped to rest and feed on its migration to central Africa

As this is only a small bird (about 8g in weight – a tad more than three to a 20p coin) it wears out two sets of feathers each year flying to Africa and back. It feeds on small insects like aphids in the treetops, so is not always easy to see. But its liquid, cascading song is commonplace in the north where most of the UK population now breeds. Like many other summer migrants, their breeding range is steadily moving north for a variety of reasons. Not least of these is the disappearance of scrubland like that where the bird on the left was ringed. Scrub can still be found in villages around Maidstone, although it's often considered 'waste ground' by planners and developers and is targeted for housing.

There was plenty of it about in the time of Gilbert White, a Hampshire parson who wrote 'The Natural History of Selborne'. Selborne is worth a visit as Captain Oates of "I'm just going outside, I may be some time" fame was born there and has museums to both. One of White's many claims to fame in an age before telescopes and David Attenborough documentaries was to identify the willow warbler as a different species from the almost identical looking wood warbler and chiffchaff. Up to then they had all been known as willow wrens.

Our remaining scrubby areas, therefore, be they an overgrown orchard, or an overlooked plot of land of the edge of our village, are high quality habit for flora and fauna. But change is on the way - not just to meet our greed for land, but because of the climate emergency. If willow warblers fly the thousands of miles to Africa only to find their wintering quarters destroyed, they won't be coming back here - but we can be sure the destruction will be driving the local human population in our direction.

The latest IPCC report on the climate emergency was frightening. It was a "wake up call for humanity" said the Prime Minister, who appears to have promptly turned over and gone back to sleep. Imagine a village with no birdsong. We still need it - if only to cover up the snoring of politicians.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

- In line with the Government Guidelines for lifting COVID restrictions, the Parish Council Monthly Meetings have resumed in the Old School Hall (OSH), Lower Road. Anyone attending will be kindly asked to continue to wear masks when indoors, sanitise hands on entry to the hall (or re-entry if leaving and returning). Toilet facilities are limited and are included in the Risk Assessment carried out by the Owners of the hall. There is limited parking availability and limited seating space in the Old School Hall.
- It was AGREED that the Open Forum at the beginning of Parish Council Meetings will be reinstated in line with the lifting of COVID restrictions (see EFPC Agenda for details).

AGENDA ITEMS & MATTERS RAISED

- Review of Planning Matters: All planning items (incl. planning applications, enforcement issues, planning appeals etc.) can be viewed on the Agendas/Minutes which are published on the East Farleigh Parish Website (www.eastfarleigh-pc.org.uk), Notice Boards and other social media. Alternatively, all planning information can be found on the MBC Planning portal https://pa.midkent.gov.uk.
- **July 2021 Meeting of the Parish Council:** The Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 6th July 2021 were approved as a true and accurate record.
- Matters Arising from the Minutes of the EFPC Meeting held on 6th July 2021: None.
- Parish Councillors' Matters:
 - i) The Clerk reported attending an on-line workshop regards "Cyber Security" and circulated the leaflet "The Good Councillors Guide to Cyber Security".
 - ii) A resident had raised concerns about an HGV incident in Dean Street that had become an abusive situation. Police were called and it was agreed that this was the appropriate action to take in such circumstances. It was also noted that all KCC Highways HGV signs in Dean Street are advisory and not regulatory. However, EFPC Highways Working Group (HWG) are actively pursuing ways to deal with traffic/lorries in the village and the "Lorry Watch Scheme" is still ongoing. There will be a meeting between KCC Highways and EFPC HWG.
- The Mayor's Court of Survey "Swan Upping": The Mayor, Cllr Fay Gooch, will be greeted at East Farleigh Lock by EFPC Chairman, Cllr John Wilson, his wife and The Clerk to EFPC and other Councillors. The Clerk's young granddaughter will present The Mayor with a presentation basket of flowers.
- **Finance:** All finance items are printed/ published in the approved Minutes of all EFPC Meetings and can be viewed on the EFPC Website. This month's payments were approved. Other Financial matters and accounts can be found on the Parish Website under the heading "Publication Scheme What we spend and how we spend it" www.eastfarleigh-pc.org.uk
- Air Quality Monitoring;
 - i) The Clerk is to chase MBC for data from the Diffusion Tubes.
- ii) It was AGREED that there should be further signs on Station Hill "Turn off Engines when stationary" to limit emissions. However, it was also noted that some newer cars do have "Stop/Start" engines. It was AGREED to investigate whether extra signage can be funded by KCC Highways (HWG will take this forward to their meeting with Highways).

- Vicarage Lane Play Area/Rec Ground: Some playground equipment repairs have been completed. EFPC to carry out regular monitoring alongside the monthly MBC inspection and weekly Pearsons inspections to make sure the Play Area and Rec Ground is tidy, safe and secure.
- **Speedwatch/Operation Scarecrow**; Speedwatch is ongoing and new dates for the Police speed check scheme (Operation Scarecrow) will be made available to the Council Members.
- Footpaths:
 - i) EFPC Councillors will continue regular walks of allocated PROW Footpaths in the village to ensure that public rights of way are clear and useable. However, everyone was reminded that any problems can be reported directly via the KCC website https://www.kent.gov.uk/environment-waste-and-planning/public-rights-of-way/report-a-problem-on-a-right-of-way. Councillors will report to the Clerk who will produce a "Footpath Report" for each meeting.
 - ii) It was noted that any problems with pavements or paths (NOT PROW) that come under the jurisdiction of KCC Highways can be reported direct to KCC via https://www.kent.gov.uk/roads-and-travel/report-a-problem (this includes but not limited to; overgrowth, obstruction to pavements or highways, potholes etc).
- **Correspondence**: The Clerk is to ask Cllr Simon Webb to investigate the problem of not having a regular PCSO presence in the village.
- Absences: The East Farleigh Parish Council office will be closed from 1pm on Thursday 12th August until Tuesday 30th August 2021 (includes Bank Holiday) because of The Clerk's Annual Leave. (Normal office hours are Mons-Thurs, 9am until 1pm)

We are sorry to have to report that we have had real difficulties since the Farmers' Market re-opened in June. Several stallholders have let us down at the last minute and this has resulted in customers being disappointed, which is the last thing we want.
