

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Weekend June 5th

On Sunday June 5th St Mary's Hunton will be replacing the usual service at 9,30am with a Special Service to celebrate the Queens Platinum Jubilee. It will be a service of hymns, readings and prayer and all are welcome to attend. It is also Whit Sunday or Pentecost Sunday and Holy Trinity, Coxheath will be celebrating Holy Communion at 11am. within the benefice.

This month we are celebrating the Queen's Platinum jubilee. Given that she's reigned for 70 years many of us can't imagine what it will be like without a queen as head of state. Some people love the monarchy, some don't and for many there is an air of indifference around the whole Royal Family.

In early drafts of this letter I found myself wanting to say things like 'the Queen must feel....' Or 'the Queen must think....' and that got me thinking about how much we know about, not only public figures but about each other. I don't know the Queen personally; who am I to make assumptions about how she feels or what she thinks? There are times when I can't even work out what my children are thinking let alone someone I have never met!

There are a variety of sayings along the theme of walking a mile in another person's shoes before you comment on their life and choices. But how quick are we to jump to conclusions about someone's decisions or appearance?

Even innocuous sounding comments like 'wow, look at the size of the heels on your shoes, I couldn't walk in those!' can have an affect on the person on the receiving end depending on their mental state, the tone and manner in which the comment is made. There are so many variables. And how much harder must it be for those in the public eye who often have to play to the expectations put upon them rather than show how they actually feel? How difficult must it be to keep smiling and doing your duty rather than reacting with your true emotions?

Recently one of my granddaughters said she wasn't talking to her sister because she'd been told if she didn't have anything nice to say don't say anything at all (there'd been an issue with friends at school). But if only we could all learn that and only say kind things to each other and use our words to build each other up. In his letter to Titus, St Paul writes 'no insults, no fights. God's people should be big hearted and courageous'* Surely this is a message we could all get behind, no matter what our beliefs?

So let's all 'engage our brains before speaking' and make sure that the words we use are gracious. Our Queen has been a great example of this over her 70 years as monarch always polite and with an encouraging word for those she meets whilst out and about and whatever you think about her we can all be thankful for that.

• <u>Village Speedwatch:</u> A new Speedwatch Co-ordinator and Volunteers are **URGENTLY** needed.

The Co-ordinator's role involves holding the EFPC Speedwatch equipment, collection of data and managing a team of volunteers. It was reported that East Farleigh was a pilot area for "Speedwatch" and the first one in Kent so it would be a real loss if this scheme was unable to continue.

There were not enough volunteers stepping forward from previous pleas for help and the Speedwatch Scheme has now been temporarily suspended pending appointment of a new Co-ordinator and team.

- <u>Defibrillators</u>: It was reported that back-up pads have now been replaced and the new expiry date is 2026. Both EFPC defibrillators (Old School Hall and top of Gallants Lane) are now on "The Circuit" which alerts all emergency services to their location.
- <u>Pearsons (Village Maintenance)</u>: The maintenance team are to be reminded that all sight lines at junctions around the village are to be kept clear.
- Highways:
 - (i) A report of the Highways Working Group (HWG) meeting held on 26/04/2022 was read out.
 - (ii) Public Consultation update: All questionnaires have now been collated and data will be produced for publication. It was reported that there had been a good response from residents.
 - (iii) It was further noted that there is an app called "**Country Eye**" which allows residents to photograph offending HGV's and report same.
- <u>Vehicle Operators Licence</u>: The Parish Council have shared their worries about this application with the Office of the Traffic Commissioner and our local borough Councillor. This matter is ongoing.
- Parish Councillors: East Farleigh Parish Council are entitled to 9 Councillor seats, at the time of going to press, there are 2 (TWO) seats available. EFPC need a full compliment of Councillors to make an impact on matters involving the village and its residents.


