BULLET POINT SUMMARY ARISING FROM EAST FARLEIGH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE OLD SCHOOL HALL, LOWER ROAD ON Tuesday 5th April 2022 @ 7.00pm

- <u>Crime Report https://www.e-watch.co:</u> On Wednesday 2nd of March around 05:05 in Forge Lane. Somebody took items without permission. Crime Report No. 46/39743/22 Posted 06/03/2022
- <u>Village Speedwatch</u>: A new Speedwatch Co-ordinator is <u>urgently</u> needed. If a new Co-ordinator is not found, this village will lose its Speedwatch Scheme. The Co-ordinator's role involves holding the EFPC Speedwatch equipment, collection of data and managing a team of volunteers (more volunteers always needed). It was reported that East Farleigh was a pilot area for "Speedwatch" and the first one in Kent so it would be a real loss if this scheme was unable to continue. Please let the Clerk know if you can help. Thank you. Separately, the Police Speed Checks will continue.
- The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations/Queen's Green Canopy Tree Planting initiative:
 - (i) The main event will replace the Annual Village Fete. If you are interested in taking part or helping out, please contact the Clerk or Cllr Adam Palmer (adam.palmer@eastfarleigh-pc.org.uk Tel: 07711 318714).
 - (ii) Local groups and organisations are being encouraged to contribute to the main event for this special occasion on **Saturday 4th June from 1pm to 5pm.**
 - (iii) Woodland Trust free saplings already ordered will be planted around the village to mark the occasion. There will be some saplings available at the main event for villages to take away for planting with a form to complete to show the location of the planted tree. If you are interested in helping to plant these trees, please contact the Clerk.

Highways:

- (i) Another Highways Working Group (HWG) meeting is scheduled.
- (ii) The deadline for submitting comments on the East Farleigh Highways Public Consultation has now passed. The data will be collated, analysed and forwarded to KCC Highways.
- <u>Vehicle Operators Licence</u>: It was reported that there has been an application for a VOL on Lower Road and several parishioners have raised objections. The Parish Council share their worries about this application and have requested that the Borough/County Councillor investigate and support these concerns.
- <u>Parish Councillors:</u> East Farleigh Parish Council are entitled to 9 Councillor seats, at the time of going to press, there is one seat available.
