RECREATION GROUND- PLAYGROUND

If you haven't visited already, please go, and visit our newly refurbished playground on the East Farleigh Recreation Ground, 12 Vicarage Ln, East Farleigh, Maidstone ME15 0LY.



These grounds along with the playground were gifted to East Farleigh Parish Council many years ago in a charity trust. The playground was becoming very tired and had some arising safety issues. The Parish Council worked very hard on this project, gaining various quotes, and going through many design options, to best benefit the playground and also to be very mindful of village funds. We replaced two of the existing items of play equipment that were getting worn out with three new items, complete with new gates and surfacing where required.

We received the following grants towards the refurbishment:

£1000 members grant from Simon Webb
MBC

£1000 grant via KALC /KCC Helping Hands

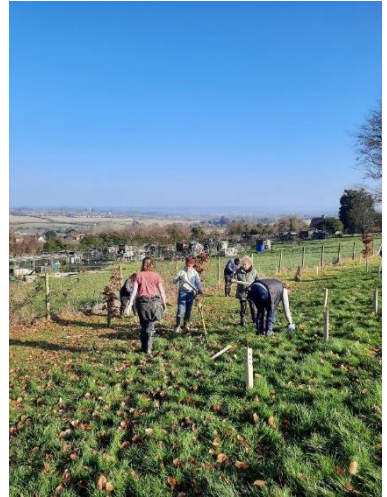
£500 grant from Goldings Homes



We used £5844.60 from CIL contributions. The Community infrastructure Levy is a charge that local authorities can set on new development in order to raise funds to help fund the infrastructure, facilities and services.

RECREATION GROUND- TREE PLANTING

We jumped upon the chance to join in with Kent County Councils' ambition for Kent to extend tree cover by 1.5 million new trees. Working with Medway Valley Countryside Partnership we planted many new trees on the Recreation Ground. Thank you for all the local volunteers for your hard work on this great project.



THE BULL INN EAST FARLEIGH

The pub has been closed since the last owners vacated many months ago. It is owned by Stonegate Group and the Parish Council reached out to them to find out what they had planned for the future. Stonegate's regional manager attended a meeting with us and said that they were currently advertising the pub for lease, but had not yet ruled out development if they couldn't find new tenants.

The Parish Council decided to hold a public residents meeting on 19th July 2023, to discuss the options available and to bring together members of the community to discuss the future of our historic landmark.

We had a huge turnout to the meeting and a working group has now been formed (outside of the Parish Council). Thank you to everyone who attended our meeting and to those that are now also part of the working group.

THE BULL INN EAST FARLEIGH CONT.

The working group has given the following statement:

The Bull Inn is boarded up and has been closed for a year; its structure is deteriorating at an alarming rate, forming an eyesore at the heart of the village. Additionally, you may have noticed that a large part of the car park and garden have been separated from the main site by a substantial fence. This is because Stonegate, the PubCo that owns The Bull, intends to apply for planning permission for housing development.

Following the village meeting held on 19th July, a working group was formed to look into how the village may be able to acquire the pub on behalf of the community. After considering various financial projections, taking on the tenancy of the pub under Stonegate's terms was considered commercially unviable. We have since spent our time preparing for the day when it may be possible to buy the freehold of the pub, if Stonegate can be persuaded to sell. We hope to be able to send out a village-wide questionnaire soon, to poll which activities and services residents would like to see at a community-owned pub. In the meantime, we have a new website and Facebook page to keep you in touch with developments. These have only just been constructed so please excuse any early errors! You can register your interest and support on the website which will help us to assess whether there is sufficient momentum within our village to make a community-owned pub feasible. Wouldn't it be nice to have a community-owned pub run by the community on behalf of the community! Over to you! The Farleigh Bull Community Pub Group

The WI meet twice a month – the 2nd Wednesday each month at 7pm for a meeting with either a speaker or activity and the last Monday of each month for a catch-up lunch and natter at 12 noon. Regular outings and events are arranged from suggestions by members. HIGHWAYS CONT.

In addition, your council has asked for slow warning signs and road markings in Gallants Lane at sites where there is a blind bend, to draw attention to the possibility that there may be pedestrians walking unseen.

The highest priority on our improvement plan is to resolve the issue of heavy goods vehicles causing delay and damage in Dean Street. We are considering an independent video survey over a 3-day period in 2 locations in Dean Street in an attempt to capture incident footage that can be presented to KCC highways as evidence as part of a case for measures to alleviate the problem.

Potholes and pavement surface degradation had been a concern in our village in common with many other towns. Such issues can be reported to KCC highways directly by any member of the public using their website facility. You can also use this link to report drainage and overgrown vegetation.

DEFIBRILLATORS

East Farleigh has two Defibrillators – they are located at the following locations:

1. Old School Hall on wall at the end of the alley between the Hall and the adjacent house.
2. Gallants Lane near Crittenden Bungalows in a BT phone box

The two defibrillators are registered with The Circuit which alerts the emergency services when the defibrillators are utilised. They are checked weekly to ensure that they remain in full working order.

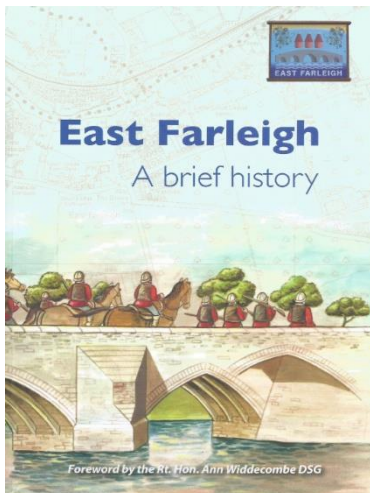
